I was born at Yuelamu and I grew up here with my parents. I went to school at Yuelamu up until I was 15. I played softball and basketball.

When I was 16 I started working at the Mt Allen homestead. From there I worked as shop assistant in the Yuelamu community store. I'm married to David Stafford, we're still a happy married couple. I've got two children, teenagers, a boy Elsin and girl Nadia.

When Yuelamu Women's Centre started up in the 1980s I started working there and I've been a Women's Centre worker all the time since then. Women's Centre looks after old people and young people in the community. We give them a good meal every day. Sometimes we have a barbeque and welcome visitors to the community. Sometimes I help the childcare workers to look after the children and to learn the proper way to do their job. Women's Centre started up the Child Care Centre.

I am happy to do Nintiringtjaku work. I am happy to help visitors when they come to work in Yuelamu, even though I might feel a bit shy sometimes. Warlpiri is my first language, and I understand and talk in Anmatjere and in English too.
